
- **Fully meet all applicable Copper Mark standards within 24 months of signing this Letter of Commitment;**

Assurance Activities, Responsibilities and Timeframes

The Copper Mark and Climax understand that upon signing this Letter of Commitment the participant will complete the steps and activities detailed in the Copper Mark Assurance process within specified timelines, as detailed in the following table:

Assurance Activity	Timeframe
Submit self-assessment	Within 6 months of signing the LOC
Site-level assessment completed (If applicable)	Within 12 months of signing the LOC
Improvement plan agreed with the assessor	Within 1 month of completion of the determination
Verification by an assessor that all criteria are “fully meets”	Within 12 months of completion of the site assessment
Submission of an application for re-assessment	Within 3 years of eligibility to make a claim or on a significant change and/or incident at the producer’s site.

These deadlines may be extended by the Copper Mark at its discretion. Failure of the participant to meet its obligations within the timeframe may lead to the participant being disassociated by the Copper Mark.
